The fall in Pitt County comes with a sign of new beginnings, mainly with the schools, colleges, and universities beginning a new semester.

We are excited about some emerging arts programs that are community based. Here are some snippets of what is on the horizon:

Arts District in Greenville: In October 2019, the Pitt County Arts Council will be approaching the Greenville City Council and presenting their recommendations for a proposed Arts District in the center city.

SmART City Grant: The City of Greenville has received a grant from the North Carolina Arts Council to hire an artist/design team to create a vision plan for "The Emerald Loop," an arts based streetscape plan in and around Uptown Greenville. This fall we will have opportunities for the community to engage with Laura Haddad and Tom Drugan, two incredible artists and designers, to bring out Greenville's unique character to this plan.

Sculpture on the Greenway: You will read a little bit about this in this issue of the ArtZine, but get your shoes on and hit the Greenway to see these amazing sculptures while getting your exercise in or reflecting on nature. This is a great collaboration between the Arts Council, the City of Greenville, and ECU's School of Art and Design.

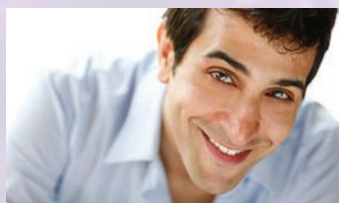

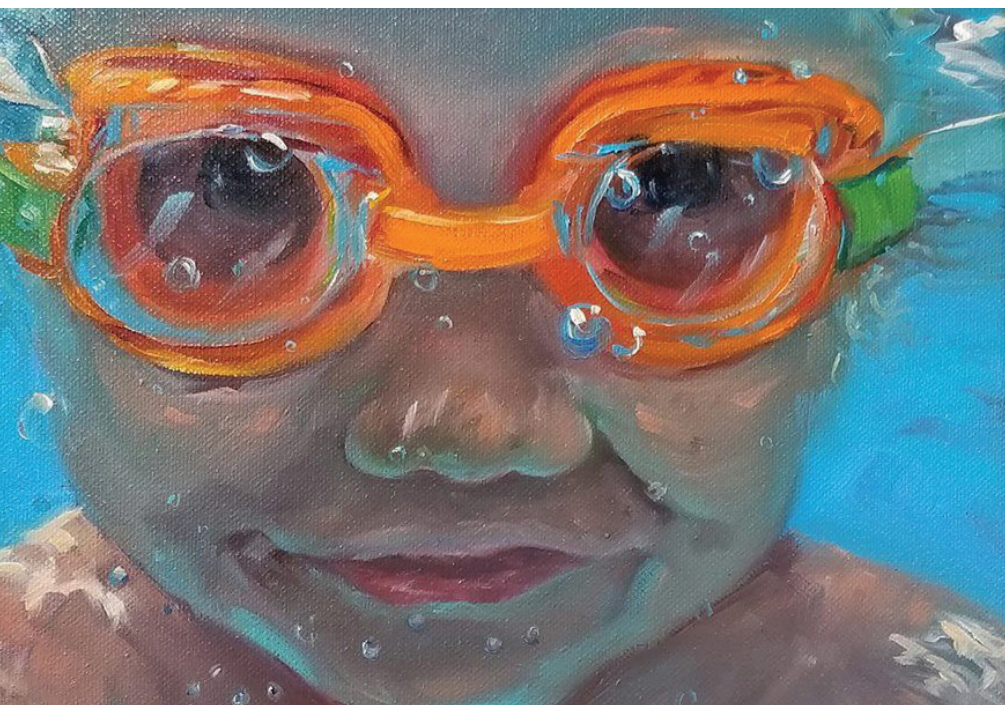

Greenville Brushstrokes



The Greenville Brushstrokes was formed to satisfy a hunger for camaraderie with people who share the passion of creating fine art with paint and brush.

A few students of a talented watercolor instructor began meeting for coffee to share ideas, techniques, and to critique each other's work. The group immediately grew so fast that a meeting place and organization was sought. In 2004 *Brushstrokes* was formed!

The growing membership consists of a gambit of artists from the novice, the hobbyist, to the accomplished professional; including instructors. Artists using all mediums of oil, watercolor, acrylics, pen and pencil are represented. Their variety of styles and techniques stimulate constant learning experiences. They share the

desire for personal growth as well as a genuine interest in helping fellow artists develop their skills. As a result, lasting friendships develop a "family" atmosphere.

Brushstrokes meets twice a month at the Greenville Museum of Art. Programs offer a myriad of presentations covering techniques, framing, products, gallery protocols, marketing and the business of art. A critique is held at every meeting. This portion of the meetings proves to be most valuable by offering feedback with both positive and constructive problem solving suggestions. Many members, especially the beginner, have overcome a reluctance to show their work through this confidence building process.

Greenville Brushstrokes

Many opportunities for members to show and sell their work come from the network *Brushstrokes* has developed over the years. Additionally *Brushstrokes* sponsors two well attended art shows each year; one in the spring and one in the fall. 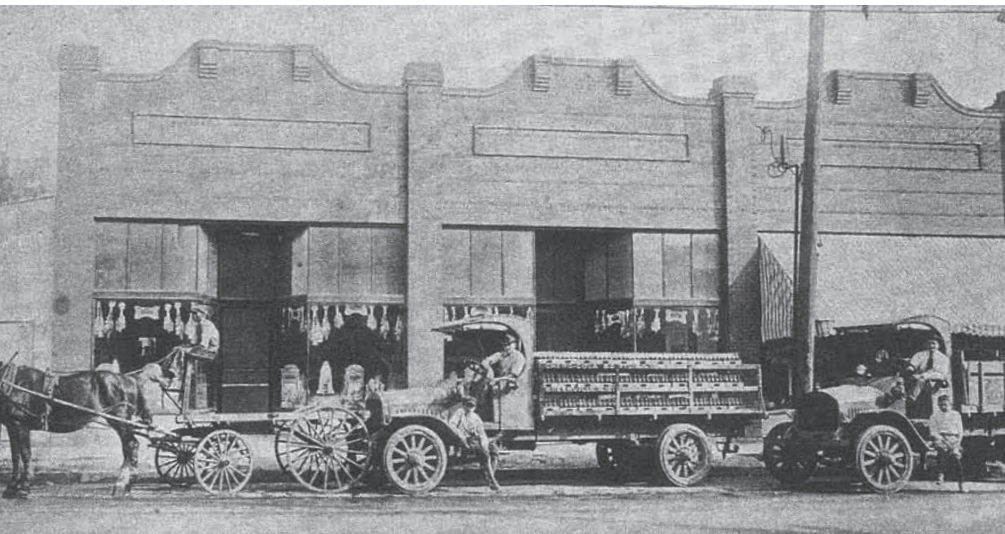

Farmers and Makers Market

Farmers and Makers Market is a year-round market space that provides a retail outlet for a range of local products and art while also serving as an incubator for entrepreneurs and artists.

The market focuses on products made or grown within 50 miles — including everything from produce, to house plants, candies, paintings and pottery. The 3,200-square-foot building, which turns 100 years old this year, was formerly part of the Chero Cola bottling facility.

Multi-tiered rate options for vendors ensure a variety of price points for leased space, creating a diverse vendor base. The concept, created by owner Ryan Webb, includes cooperative

marketing promoting the Go Local concept while fostering creativity and innovation. “In a growing Uptown business district, there’s a need for a retail venue for entrepreneurs to participate on a scale that’s suited to their needs, a place where they can work cooperatively to promote and encourage each other,” Webb said. “I want to help retain creative talent in Greenville by giving them the opportunity to make the most of their talents and passions.”

Sculpture on the Greenway

The next time you are taking a jog, walking the dog, or riding your bike along the Greenville Greenway, you will encounter some surprise gems along the way!

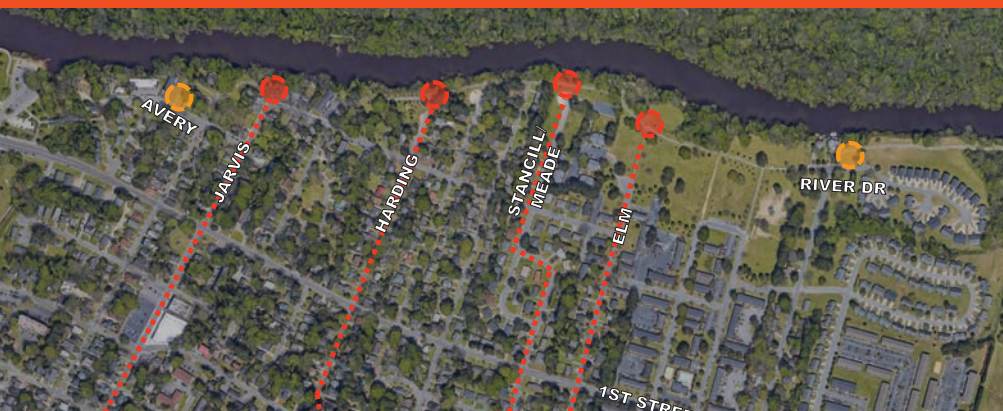
The Pitt County Arts Council in partnership with the City of Greenville's Recreation and Parks Department and the ECU School of Art and Design, have placed six sculptures along the South Tar River Greenway. The stretch between Avery Street and River Drive now have a sculpture displayed at each street access point. They can

be viewed either from the street or on the south side of the Greenway.

Two of the sculptures will rotate annually as part of the DownEast National Juried Sculpture Exhibition. There are 17 sculptures in Pitt County that are part of this exhibition, and each March a new sculpture will be installed for one year. The other three are part of a partnership with ECU School of Art and Design and their alumni who have either donated or loaned their work to the Greenway sculpture program. So come and experience this incredible town-sized gallery.

East Carolina ArtSpace

The East Carolina ArtSpace, located in Farmville, is a creative platform unique to Eastern NC. It is the desire of the developers, Dr. Craig Steffee and Todd Edwards, for the ArtSpace development to mirror the stated goals of Farmville's leadership and become a center of creative activity for all of Eastern North Carolina.

The East Carolina ArtSpace's role in this endeavor is to provide an affordable platform for such activities. At the heart of the project is a gallery space that is exclusively populated with content produced in Eastern NC by local artists, or by artists with Eastern NC ties. That content includes paintings, photography, metal work (jewelry, durable items and sculpture), ceramics, and locally made glass art, among many other offerings.

Beyond the gallery, the East Carolina ArtSpace also houses fourteen studios available to local artists at affordable rates. In addition to our in-house artists, we have other professional and retail spaces. This includes an interior design studio, Elizabeth Edwards Interiors, in one of the feature spaces. The desire is to add other design professionals into the mix in the very near future.
